

## New Hampshire Medicaid Brand over Generic List 7.1.2026

**Not All Generics are Preferred** In some instances, the State prefers the multi-source brand name drug over its generic equivalent because the branded drug is more cost effective than its generic counterpart.

- Pharmacy providers must enter a **DAW code of 9** on the claim to have it correctly priced.
