This page lists non-legend drugs that are covered by New Hampshire (NH) Medicaid when produced by manufacturers who are participating in the Department of Health and Human Services' (HHS) drug rebate agreement and prescribed by a licensed practitioner.

Insulins are covered by recipients. Please refer to the NH Preferred Drug List (PDL) for the insulins that are available without prior authorization.

Narcan® (naloxone) and Opill® (norgestrel) are covered by NH Medicaid in **brand and generic** versions.

The items in this appendix are listed alphabetically by therapeutic class, then by the generic name of the drug or drug ingredients. NH Medicaid pays on for **generic** versions of these non-legend drugs, singly or in combination, regardless of strength or dosage form unless noted. Combination products that contain active ingredients that are not covered will not be covered.
